MANHATTAN NEIGHBORHOODS
— EXPERIENCE THE CULTURE —

The diverse cultures of the local neighborhoods are the lifeline to Manhattan. Each of these neighborhoods offers their own uniqueness. If time allows, include them in your visit to our city.

Theatre District Experience the theaters of New York and you will see some of the brightest stars! There are over 30 Playhouses to choose from, all producing marvelous shows. This area has a wonderful array of shopping, restaurants and Times Square.

The Financial District/Battery Park City The Financial District is centered on Wall Street in lower Manhattan. This neighborhood contains the New York Stock Exchange, the American Stock Exchange and the Federal Reserve. The New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) dates back more than 200 years. It remains the world's foremost securities marketplace. The American Stock Exchange is the nation's second largest floor-based exchange. The AMEX deals with common stocks, index shares and securities. Only the NYSE gives tours, call ahead. Close to the Financial District are several cultural sites such as the Museum of Jewish Heritage and the National Museum of the American Indian. The World Financial Center (WFC) overlooks the Hudson River and is home to a unique collection of specialty shops and fine restaurants. Additionally, the WFC Winter Garden is host to a variety of performances and exhibitions year round. Most events are held indoors but there are special Spring/Summer events that take place on the outdoor plaza. Adjacent to the WFC is the World Trade Center, the future site of the 9-11 Memorial and the Freedom Tower.

Greenwich Village Take a stroll through "the Village" and enjoy the multitude of art galleries, architecture, cafes and Jazz Clubs. One of the few places in Manhattan where the atmosphere is laid back and at times offbeat. This is one of New York's largest historic areas. Many famous and talented people have lived in the village such as Mark Twain, Washington Irving, Edgar Allan Poe and even Madonna.

Little Italy Where there is every type of Italian food establishment. You will find restaurants, cafes, espresso bars, pastry, cheese and butcher shops. Take a stroll down Mulberry Street anywhere between Grand and Canal Streets and you will feel as if you are in Italy. Don't forget the festival times in June and September when thousands of people fill the streets eating and celebrating during the Feasts. Buon Appetito!

Lower East Side Generations of mainly Jewish immigrants during the 19th and 20th centuries lived and started their new lives here. Many of the restaurants and stores still reflect the distinctive tastes of the Jewish immigrants. Today, side by side with the linen, housewares and clothing stores are new boutiques, galleries and nightclubs. Walk the streets and find the great deals that this area has been known for. Visit the Lower East Side Tenement Museum (built in 1863) This old tenement building that has been restored so visitors can see apartments from different periods during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

Chinatown is home to over 150,000 people, making it one of the largest Chinese communities outside the Orient. A walk down the heart of Chinatown will make you feel as if you have traveled to the Orient. Even the street signs are in Chinese! Within the 40-block area of Chinatown you will find 12 Buddhist Temples. The streets are lined with restaurants boasting the best Chinese food in the West. There are stores and street vendors selling everything from silk and jade to rare mushrooms and live fish. Chinatown is truly a sight to see and a great place to sample exotic foods.

SoHo gets its name from its location, S.Outh of HOuston Street. It is a neighborhood rich in culture with modern art galleries, trend setting fashion boutiques, eclectic restaurants and cast-iron architecture. The Guggenheim Museum now has a SoHo branch at 530 Broadway. This landmark structure of red brick, still maintains its original cast-iron storefronts. If you're in the market for antiques, collectables and memorabilia, try visiting the SoHo Antique Fair held every Saturday and Sunday at Broadway and Grand Street.

South Street Seaport South Street Seaport is restored to the way it looked in the 1800's. Don't miss Schermerhorn Row with its shops from 1811. Walk over to the piers and board one of the tall ships or the Ambrose Lighthouse Boat, see how the sailing men lived.

TriBeCa In the 1960's the city planners came up with this name to designate the area that was known as the "Triangle Below Canal Street". TriBeCa in the past two decades has seen a rebirth, beautifully restored brick warehouses and lofts abound. Here you will find a large residential area, galleries, unique stores and many restaurants.
